
Piccolo House – 18 Barry Street is a rare opportunity to live within one of Kew’s most tightly held enclaves. It is a premium site that demands care, respect and design of the highest calibre. In response are five finely scaled buildings that emerge gently from the landscape, their form and materiality shaped by the rhythm of the street and the beauty of the surrounding tree canopy. These are homes in the truest sense – spacious, quiet and deeply connected to their locale.

With a new level of luxury and amenity – from concierge services to wellness spaces and curated communal areas – every element has been considered to support a life of ease and comfort. Piccolo House – 18 Barry Street reimagines apartment living through a lens of community connection, architectural clarity and domestic warmth.

Rhythmic Beauty

Piccolo House – 18 Barry Street sits quietly in one of Kew’s most established pockets – a leafy street known for its heritage homes and peaceful, neighbourly feel.

Just moments from Studley Park and Yarra Bend, the location offers an immediate connection to nature but is also only minutes to the vibrancy of Kew Junction. This rare, elevated corner site brings together the best of both worlds – green and serene yet embedded within the suburb.

The architectural vision for 18 Barry Street is grounded in restraint and connected to context. Designed by Woods Bagot, the project takes its cues from the neighbourhood – a quiet street canopied in green, lined with heritage homes and layered gardens.

Rather than a single mass, the architecture is broken into a series of pavilion-like buildings, each rigorously positioned to maximise light, privacy and outlook.

There's a deliberate softness to how the buildings meet the ground with generous setbacks and lush landscaping blurring the edge between built form and garden. Internally, layouts have house-like proportions, with high ceilings and dual aspects that create flow and openness.

The result is architecture that is confident but quiet, shaped by its environment and intended to endure.
